Dear Friends,

Ecclesiastes 3:1-2 says, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every activity under heaven... a time to plant and a time to uproot." With a commitment to honor our vision and mission and to drive this critical work forward with strength and momentum, 2019 marked a season of strategic planning for Rapha International. This was an intentional time of shining a light into each corner of our programming and asking the challenging questions of what needed improvement, what was working well, and what might need to be uprooted. One of the discoveries of our strategic planning process was that it was time to uproot the word "House" from our name and rebrand as Rapha International. We released our rebranding announcement in November of 2019 and were blessed by an outpouring of support by our partners across all sectors. By the end of 2019, we were already seeing great momentum with many of our strategic plan objectives. Additionally, funding was secured specifically to begin new initiatives that were born out of the planning process. For example -

- The Freedom Forever Endowment was birthed by faithful partners who desire the work of Rapha International to continue to serve not only this generation of child survivors but future generations as well.
- Financing was secured for a transformative new documentary that will illuminate and challenge donors concerning systemic child exploitation in Haiti to be released in 2021.
- A transitional home was launched in Cambodia for older girls who are ready to leave our aftercare program, but for whom it is unsafe to return to their own communities.
- A new social work endeavor was funded, which will help us battle against institutional exploitation of children by bringing crucial training and child protection efforts to Haitian children's homes.

Rapha International's partnership with government and civil society agencies was enhanced in every country where we are working in 2019, resulting in the incredible articles provided by our international directors in this report.

With increased opportunities to engage with government child protection units and with local law enforcement, we are able to exponentially reach more children with life-saving services.

2019 was a season of planning and growth for Rapha International. As we prepare this annual report for release, we find ourselves in a challenging season- alongside each of you. Ecclesiastes 3:5 says, "...there is a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing." This verse certainly describes a key challenge and discouragement that many of us are facing through the COVID-19 pandemic. We hope that this report will be an encouragement in this present season, and a celebration of what we have accomplished and will continue to accomplish together.

Friends, you make the critical work of Rapha International possible, and we need your help to keep our momentum strong now more than ever before. Together, we will end the trafficking and sexual exploitation of children— one child at a time.

AFTERCARE PROGRAM LAUNCHES CULTURE OF CARE AND MORE TRAUMA-INFORMED TRAININGS

We aim to create a culture of healing and compassion within our aftercare campuses at Rapha International. We know that every girl we serve and every staff member with whom we serve is made in the image of God. We honor that image by providing the highest standard of care, which includes equipping our staff to do the hard work of rehabilitation. In 2019 all staff members across our four campuses received training on Trauma Informed Care, which explained the basics of trauma's impact on the brain and behaviors. The goal of having a Trauma-Informed organization is to give everyone greater understanding of the dynamics of trauma so we do not inadvertently retraumatize the girls entrusted into our care. The Client Services staff received additional training on the Assessment of Survivor Outcomes (created and validated by the International Justice Mission). This assessment will be a useful tool throughout a survivor's time at Rapha International and will be especially helpful in determining their reintegration readiness. As our ultimate goal is to see survivors living in sustained freedom, it is vital that we set them up for success when they leave our program. Thus, we want to conduct a thorough assessment of their internal and external resources to determine any vulnerability that might exist.





In an effort to extend this culture of healing and compassion stateside, we hosted an International Directors' Meeting in conjunction with the International Conference of Missions in November. This was a fruitful week of strategic planning, encouragement, and networking. Rapha International sponsored the "Creating Trauma Informed Ministry Culture" track of workshops at ICOM, which included a presentation of the Culture of Care, the program that evolved from last year's partnership with Children's Center. This program is a combination of expert training and consultation designed to assist churches in promoting safety for children and supporting survivors of trauma. It includes a full-day, three-part training, a policy review, and two phone consultations. We know there is a strong correlation between childhood trauma and re-traumatization at a later age, including sex trafficking. While we continue combatting the traumatic effects of sex-trafficking around the world, we are also committed to halting the progression of trauma in our own country.



From the moment she walks through our doors we start planning for her exit. She walks in with her chin down; she walks out with her head held high and a bounce in her step. **She brings with her a heart heavy with pain and shame;** she leaves with a heart filled with love and hope.

At Rapha International, our aftercare program is designed to love the girls well, to foster healing, and to empower them with skills to walk with hope and confidence into the next chapter of their lives. Within the first days of arrival, each girl meets with a team of staff who help her determine the major goals during her time with us. While in our aftercare program, social workers also assist survivors regularly in setting short-term goals to promote growth and development for optimal success.

On paper this process looks neat and tidy, but in practice it's a messy mountain of hard work for survivors and staff. Yet, when we reach our destination, there is a breathtaking view to behold. We look back and celebrate all that has been accomplished. We look around and see a future filled with possibility. She looks at the path ahead and sees another mountain to climb, but she steps forward with a sense of purpose and confidence gained from what she has accomplished so far.

Our vision is to see all children living in sustainable freedom within safe communities. Upon reintegration, some of the girls we serve are continuing their education with plans to finish high school and go on to college to pursue a career. Some are pursuing further vocational training and working toward job placement. Others choose to work blue collar type jobs in their home areas. Rapha social workers follow up with each survivor until we feel confident that she is living a safe and stable life.

RAPHA THAILAND PARTNERS WITH THE ROYAL THAI POLICE AND THAI SOCIAL SERVICES

2019 was another great year in serving underage survivors for Rapha International in Thailand. As we noted in the 2018 annual report, we were awarded a new license in Thailand as an approved *Child Protection Center* which allows law enforcement to rescue survivors and bring them directly to our gates. There are only a few non-governmental organizations honored with this licensure and our staff members are leading in implementing new standards developed by Thailand's social services department to improve anti-trafficking efforts in the country.

Over the past two years, our legal team has successfully helped prosecute court cases for seven of the girls we serve.

Twenty-one convicted persons are collectively serving more than 305 years in prison for the trafficking and sexual exploitation of minors due to the efforts of the Rapha legal team working alongside law enforcement and social services in Thailand! These convictions send a powerful message to communities and would-be-perpetrators that there are great consequences for those who exploit and abuse children.

At Rapha International, we believe in partnering across multiple sectors. In 2019, we worked harder than ever before to gain partnerships with other organizations facilitating anti-trafficking work in Thailand, as well as with the Royal Thai Police. These collaborative efforts have led to a new contract, signed at the beginning of 2020, which allows our social workers to assist with police-led raids and rescue efforts in order to bring immediate care to survivors. In the first quarter of 2020 our social workers were involved with a major human trafficking raid in the south of Thailand where more than 35 Cambodian nationals were rescued—17 of those survivors being minors. Rapha International is proud of the Royal Thai Police's work and the Royal Thai Government for their commitment to combat trafficking within their borders, and we are grateful to stand with them in their efforts.

We are blessed and honored to continue to serve the Lord as we love and protect these children who are close to His heart.

RAPHA HAITI WELCOMES NEW LIFE AND A NEW REPORTING PORTAL IN THE MIDST OF POLITICAL UNREST


Although there was much to celebrate for Rapha Haiti during 2019, this year was marked by extreme political and social unrest for the country, which brought great challenges to our work. Our staff faced the threat and sometimes reality of violence en route to and from work each day. Social work efforts on behalf of the girls we serve and their families became more difficult in light of danger on the roads and fuel shortages.

While it has been historically common for us to have young mothers deliver babies while they are with us, we cared for six babies born to girls in our aftercare program in 2019. This brought about an influx of cribs, diapers, and extra nannies to help take care of babies while their mothers continued their own journeys of emotional healing and education. A baby conceived in trauma can make the road to healing an even more complicated one, but we remain committed to walking alongside each of these girls as they move forward.

Throughout 2019, Rapha International worked to form strategic partnerships with the Internet Watch Foundation, the Haitian government through the National Committee against Trafficking in Persons (CNLTP), and the Brigade for the Protection of Minors (BPM). Through these massive collaborative efforts, the first portal for reporting and dealing with online child sexual abuse images was officially launched in Haiti on May 6, 2020. This critical reporting mechanism makes it possible for Haitian citizens to be empowered to take action, and it protects children and their futures. Haiti has gained ground in combating trafficking and sexual exploitation through this endeavor, and Rapha International is grateful to have played an instrumental role in making this possible.

Construction of our new aftercare campus forged ahead, although the physical challenges caused by political unrest greatly slowed the process. We hope to announce the completion of this campus in late 2020. This high security campus will provide a beautiful place of protection and restoration as children find hope and healing.

On behalf of the staff of Rapha International Haiti, we are grateful for our financial partners who make it possible to provide life-saving services for the precious child survivors we serve. Together, we are changing the future for children, their families, and their communities.

FIRST FREEDOM TEAM LAUNCHES IN NORTHERN COLORADO

In 2018 Jessica embarked on a journey to Cambodia with Rapha International that would start her life on a path she never expected.

In early 2018, she had never heard of Rapha International. In March of that year, a simple conversation with a friend quickly turned into Jessica joining an awareness trip team. From that very moment it became obvious that God was working in her life The team traveled to Cambodia that year, and God continued speaking to her throughout the experience and it intensified as she returned home.





A few months later, God gave Jessica the idea to create a team that would advocate for Rapha and spread awareness of the plight that exploited children are facing. This idea developed into what we now call the Rapha International Freedom Teams. With the help of her friend Trista, Jessica created the Northern Colorado Rapha International Freedom Team! They began setting up booths for Rapha International at local craft shows, car shows, and cultural events. They sold merchandise and talked to people about Rapha's mission, personal experiences, and how they could partner with the work. The team also began hosting an array of their own fundraisers that benefitted Rapha International. They soon pitched the idea to the Rapha International, and we embraced this big vision. Together we have created a model that can be easily replicated all over the United States. The NoCo Freedom Team's goal is to create at least one Freedom Team in each state!

With approximately 200 international staff, our impact is global. In Haiti, Cambodia and Thailand our team of social workers visit families and local communities to educate about the trafficking and exploitation risks that their own children face. In Southwest Missouri we are members of the RISE Coalition (Regional Intervention of Sexual Exploitation), whose mission is to work together with organizations and agencies within local communities to increase public awareness, identify human trafficking cases, and connect identified victims with comprehensive social and medical services. Additionally, we serve on the Missouri Human Trafficking and Domestic Violence Commission, which aims to make Missouri courts more effective in addressing human trafficking and domestic violence.
